

**RIVERTON CITY COUNCIL**

Minutes of the  
Council Work Session  
Held January 10, 2017  
7:00 PM

A Work Session of the Riverton City Council was held on the above date and time, duly convened by Mayor John L. Baker at 7:00p.m. City Council Members present were Tim Hancock, Mike Bailey, Kyle Larson, Sean Peterson, and Holly Jibben. Council Member Bailey led the Pledge of Allegiance. Invocation was conducted by Council Member Larson.

Roll call was conducted. Mayor Baker declared a quorum of the Council. Council Member Peterson moved, seconded by Council Member Bailey to excuse Council Member Lee Martinez from tonight's meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

City Staff present were Public Works Director Kyle Butterfield, Chief of Police Mike Broadhead, and City Secretary Megan Sims.

Council Member Larson moved, seconded by Council Member Bailey to approve the agenda as written. Motion passed unanimously.

**Northern Arapaho Solid Waste Proposal Discussion** – Ryan Ortiz, Environmental Director with Wind River Environmental Quality Commission, approached the Council with a proposal to haul City sanitation to the Northern Arapaho Tribe's (NAT) transfer station instead of the Fremont County Solid Waste Disposal District's (FCSWDD) transfer station. Mr. Ortiz outlined the benefits of their transfer station stating that it will operate Monday – Saturday, being open one more day a week than the FCSWDD transfer station. Mr. Ortiz also stated that the tipping fees will be \$70 a ton rather than \$80 a ton. However, they would not offer recycling which is currently saving the City on how much it pays in disposal fees. Andy Frey and Mike Dimick were also in attendance regarding the solid waste proposal discussion. No action was taken. Mr. Ortiz would like direction from the Council in the next 1-3 months.

**Allowing Ducks in City Limits Discussion** – Public Works Director Kyle Butterfield lead the Council in a discussion regarding allowing ducks in City limits. Mr. Butterfield presented facts of advantages and disadvantages for housing ducks. It is the consensus of the Council to have staff draft an ordinance allowing ducks in City limits. No action was taken.

**Adjourn** – There being no further business to come before the Council, Council Member Larson, moved, seconded by Council Member Peterson to adjourn the meeting at 8:38 p.m. Motion passed unanimously.
