Minutes of the
Council Work Session
Held April 8, 2014
7:00 PM

A Work Session of the Riverton City Council was held on the above date and time, duly convened by Mayor Ron Warpness at 7:00p.m. City Council Members present were Rich Gard, Martin Cannan, Mary Ellen Christensen, Jonathan Faubion, Kyle Larson, and Todd Smith. Council Member Smith led the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Staff present were City Administrator Steven Weaver, City Clerk/Administrative Services Director Courtney V. Bohlender, Chief of Police Mike Broadhead, Community Development Director Sandy Luers, Interim Public Services Director Dawn Willhelm, and Administrative Secretary Kristin Watson.

Council Member Faubion moved, seconded by Council Member Smith to approve the agenda as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Resolution No. 1296 – WAM Support for Local Authority on Temporary Suspension of Liquor Licenses – Council Member Faubion moved, seconded by Council Member Smith to remove Resolution No. 1296 from the table. Motion passed with Council Member Larson voting nay. Council Member Faubion moved, seconded by Council Member Gard to approve Resolution No. 1296 as amended at the previous meeting. Motion passed with Council Member Christensen voting nay.

Farmer’s Market Discussion – City Administrator Steven Weaver presented some background information on the Farmer’s Market. Sherry Shelley also addressed the Council on the Farmer’s Market and the location of the market. There was discussion from members of the public and Council regarding the Farmer’s Market and its future location.

Transfer of Detox Building from City to Center of Hope – City Administrator Steven Weaver presented a request from the Center of Hope on the transfer of the Detox Building. It was the consensus of the Council to continue moving forward and looking for different options and ideas for the building.

Utility Rate Discussion – Interim Public Services Director Dawn Willhelm presented the proposed utility rate increases of 1.1% in water, 7% in sewer, and 1.1% in sanitation. In a separate discussion, Community Development Director Sandy Luers presented the proposed building rate increase of 1.1%.

Adjourn - There being no further business to come before the Council, Council Member Gard moved, seconded by Council Member Christensen to adjourn the meeting at 8:56 p.m. Motion passed unanimously.
