

RIVERTON CITY COUNCIL

Minutes of the
Council Work Session
Held August 13, 2013
7:00 PM

A Work Session of the Riverton City Council was held on the above date and time, duly convened by Mayor Ron Warpness at 7:00p.m. City Council Members present were Rich Gard, Todd Smith, and John 'Lars' Baker (arrived at 7:07p.m.). Council Member Faubion led the Pledge of Allegiance.

City Staff present were City Administrator Steven Weaver, Police Chief Mike Broadhead, City Clerk/Administrative Services Director Courtney V. Bohlender, Community Development Director Sandy Luers and Acting Public Services Director Dawn Willhelm.

Council Member Gard moved, seconded by Council Member Faubion to excuse Eric Heiser and Mary Ellen Christensen from tonight's meeting. Motion passed unanimously.

Council Member Faubion moved, seconded by Council Member Smith to approve the agenda as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Riverton Water Supply Project – Discussion: City Administrator Weaver began the discussion by reporting on the project which encompasses the expansion of the Riverton water supply. This project is grant funded by the Wyoming Water Development Commission with a 66%-33% match. He reported this project includes extending a transmission line from the Job Corp site west to the Raintree Estates Subdivision, south to Riverview Road and east on Riverview trying into the existing water main near the intersection of Country Club Drive and Riverview Road. These areas are recommended for the Phase 3-Pressure Zone 4 portion of this project which will serve this future growth area. Other discussion included an emergency bulk water agreement with the Mountain View Water District and acquiring the necessary easements from the Tribes in exchange for the cost of constructing the Cowboy Lane waterline. It was also discussed that Mountain View Water District should be required to pay for part of the cost of constructing either a portion of the Phase 3 – Pressure Zone 4 project or they may be able to help with the cost of Cowboy Lane. The consensus of the Council was to seek additional funding in October, 2014 and ask the Tribes to contribute funding as well as easements for the Cowboy Lane portion of this project. Landowners on Cowboy Lane may also be asked to contribute to a portion of the project.

Adjourn - There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Warpness adjourned the meeting at 7:54 p.m. Motion passed unanimously.
