

**RIVERTON CITY COUNCIL**

Minutes of the  
Work Session

Held September 11, 2018  
7:00 PM

A Work Session of the Riverton City Council was held on the above date and time, duly convened by Mayor John L. Baker at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers, Riverton City Hall. City Council Members present were Lance Goede, Tim Hancock, Kyle Larson, Sean Peterson (telephonically) and Rebecca Schatza. Council Member Schatza led the Pledge of Allegiance. Invocation was conducted by Council Member Larson.

Roll call was conducted. Council Member Hancock moved, seconded by Council Member Goede to excuse Council Member(s) Mike Bailey from tonight's meeting. Motion passed unanimously. Mayor Baker declared a quorum of the council.

City Staff present were: City Administrator Tony Tolstedt, Chief of Police Eric Murphy, City Attorney Rick Sollars, Community Development Director Eric P. Carr and Deputy City Clerk/Administrative Assistant Megan Sims.

Council Member Goede moved, seconded by Council Member Schatza for the approval of the agenda as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

**Google Map Presentation** – City Administrator Tony Tolstedt presented a google-based map of the City of Riverton. This map will include locations for businesses in the following categories: Lodging, Restaurants, Parks & Recreation, Education, Emergency Services, Government, Gas Stations & Vehicle Repair Shops, Entertainment, Grocery & Pharmacy, and Transportation. This map will be available on the City of Riverton's website. No action was taken.

**Habitually Intoxicated Individual Ordinance Discussion** – City Administrator Tony Tolstedt presented a proposed ordinance from the newly appointed Solutions Committee. This ordinance addresses the sale of, the gift of, and delivery of any alcoholic or malt beverage to a habitual intoxicated individual and that it is unlawful to do so. If the liquor license holder violates this ordinance, it may result in a penalty and/or punishment to said holder. It is defined in the ordinance that a habitual intoxicated individual is an individual that has been convicted of six (6) or more alcohol related offenses within a six (6) month period of time. It was the consensus of the Council to move forward with the Ordinance and present it at the next meeting on September 18, 2018. No action was taken.

**Adjourn** – There being no further business to come before the Council, Council Member Goede, moved, seconded by Council Member Hancock to adjourn the meeting at 8:20 p.m. Motion passed unanimously.
